Scope of the Conference

Handicrafts often use natural materials and eco-friendly techniques, promote sustainability and add unique character and authenticity to designs, appealing to consumers seeking distinctive products. The design industry is increasingly recognizing the value of integrating handicrafts into design which offers a multitude of benefits including preservation of traditional skills and cultural heritage, aiding in providing a sustainable livelihood for artisans and achieving overall sustainable development of the craft and artisans. This conference aims to foster cross-cultural understanding and appreciation of handicrafts in enriching the design landscape. The conference also aims for deliberations and publication of research in the area of craft training, design, technology integration and entrepreneurship with a focus on research and bringing positive changes for craft as well as craft communities. We aim to encourage researchers to submit their research in as much detail as possible. The broad scope of the conference is to encourage research and scholarly deliberations in the direction of:

- **Historical Perspectives - Past:** The conference will delve into the historical evolution of handicrafts, tracing their origins and their role in past societies as well as preserving cultural heritage by highlighting their significance and encouraging their continuation.
- **Current Challenges and Opportunities - Present:** Discussions will focus on the challenges faced by the sector, such as competition from mass-produced goods, lack of market access, and declining interest among younger generations. It will also explore emerging opportunities, like e-commerce and sustainable practices.
- **Future Implications - Prospects:** The conference aims to envision the future of the handicraft sector, considering trends like customization, fusion with contemporary design, and the integration of technology. It will also look into craft as a tool for economic development and its contribution to local and national economies, providing employment opportunities, especially in rural areas.
- **Skill Development and Innovation:** The conference aims to serve as a platform for knowledge sharing and skill development for artisans in order to aid them in improving their techniques and explore new design possibilities.

By addressing these aspects, the conference can contribute to the sustainable growth and development of the handicraft sector.

Guidelines for Extended Abstract Submission

- The acceptable word count for the abstract is 2500 to 3000 words.
- We encourage the authors to send an informative and structured abstract as per the following template:
 - o Article title
 - o Author Details: Name, Designation, Email Address, and Affiliation of all authors
 - o Structured Abstract:
 - Purpose
 - Methodology/Approach
 - Findings
 - Practical/Theoretical implications
 - Originality/value
 - Keywords: Minimum 3 and Maximum 5

Guidelines for Full Paper Submission

- All manuscripts should be submitted in PDF format through easy chair.
- The acceptable word range for the full paper is 6,000 – 9,000 words, including references, and should necessarily have sections like Abstract, Introduction, Theoretical background, Methodology, Data Analysis, Findings, Design Implications, Conclusions, and References.
- The manuscript should be copy-edited for grammar and language errors.
- APA referencing style should be used.
- The font should be Times New Roman, size 12, double spaced, and left-aligned.

- Tables, figures, and images should be appropriately named and of good quality.
- The paper should be submitted along with a Plagiarism Report and the Similarity Index of not more than 10%.

Benefits of Participation

- All presenting authors will be awarded an E-certificate.
- Selected papers will be published in a book of conference proceedings with an ISBN which will be indexed in SCOPUS subject to quality and indexing parameters.
- Selected authors will be invited to elaborate on their research topic and submit their papers to SCOPUS or WOS indexed journals subject to fulfilling journal quality parameters. These special issue tie-ups will be intimated as and when they happen.
- The three best papers from the conference will be awarded cash prizes of Rs. 15,000, Rs, 10,000 and Rs. 5,000 for the first, second and third positions respectively.
